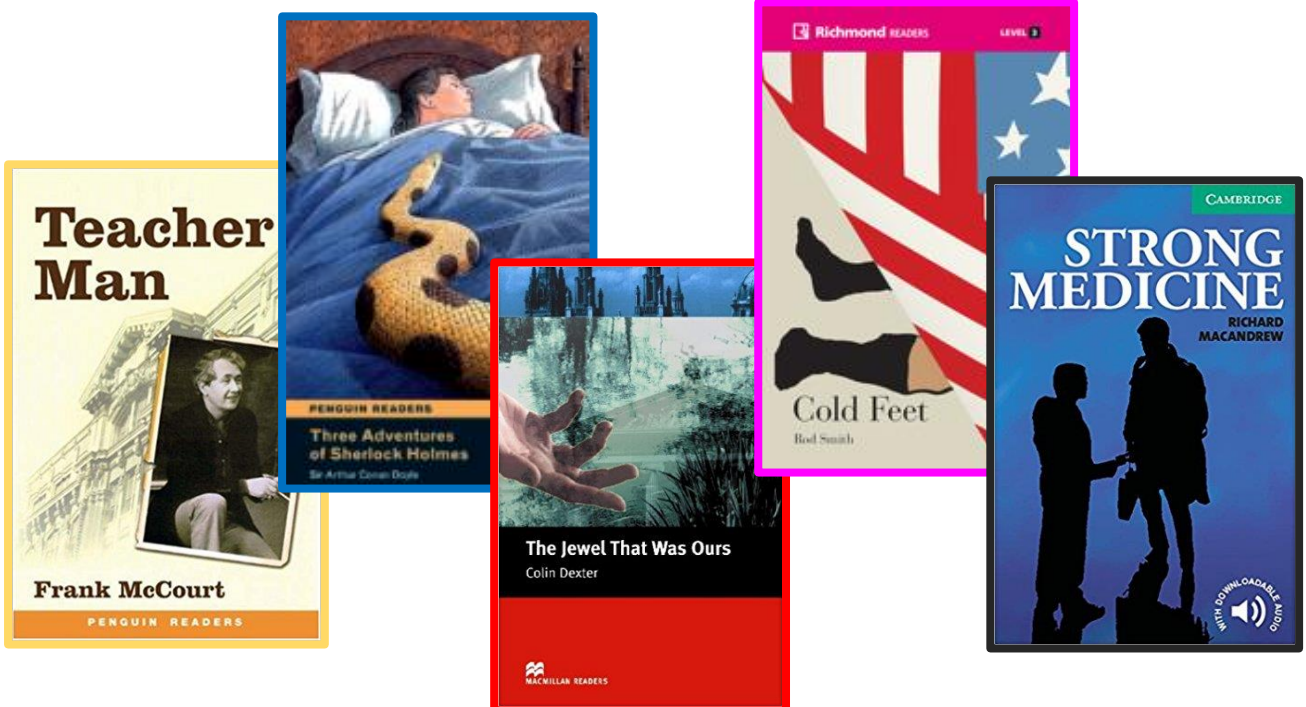

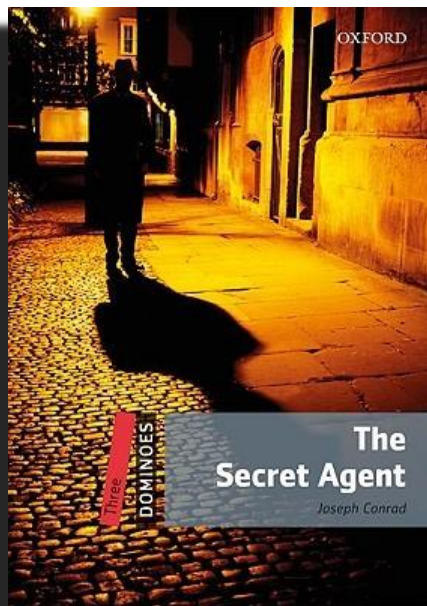


# The Secret Agent
