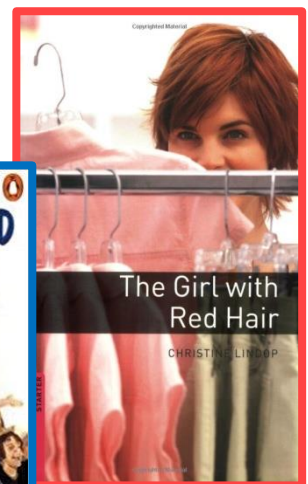
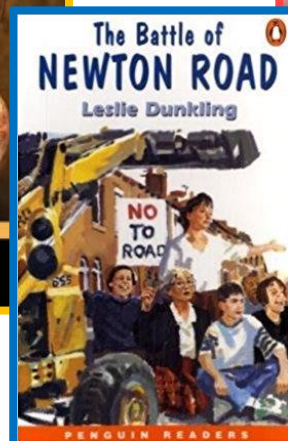

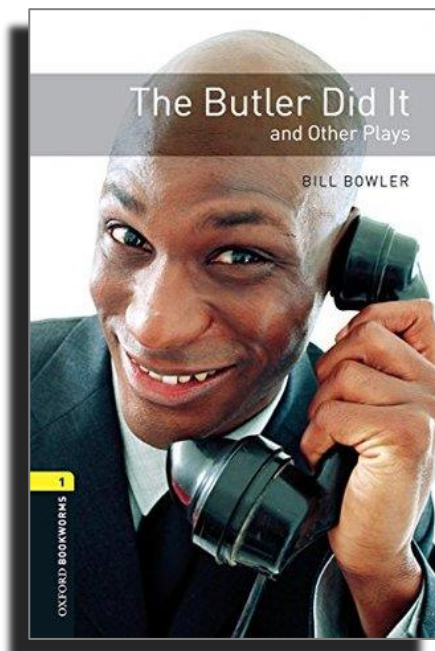


The Butler Did It (and Other Plays)
